Al's years with the National Park Service and subsequently since his retirement from NPS have seen an impressive series of contributions in publications. research, and service in the interpretation of the culture history of the American Southwest. We look forward to a positive response from you and anticipate an appropriate tribute to Al.

Such schemes as this invariably become known to the honoree in the course of planning and preparations. Ideally (and perhaps naively!), it is hoped that this particular effort can remain unknown to Al until the volume's actual appearance and presentation! Most often, the only person fooled into this illusion is the editor and contributors; nonetheless, it seems it would be worth the try on everyone's part. In any case, your cooperation in this endeavor will be greatly appreciated.



Your Regional Correspondents (RCs) have been sent a second draft of PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE PROGRAMMATIC MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT FOR THE COAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAM.!! It cost MAC approximately \$100.00 to distribute 25 copies of this document. Several RC's were able to generate comments within a very short time. This speaks well of our interest and concern over regulatory changes. RCs are being sent concurrently with this MEMSMAC the following information items which may be of interest to the membership:

INCREASING COMMERCIAL VAMDALISM IN WEST CENTRAL NEW MEXICO?

Another "Tularosa Phase" site in the vicinity of Apache Creek is documented to have been vandalized with mechanical equipment (a backhoe) during Movember. The vandalized portion of the site is on private lands but the site is partially on Gila Mational Forest lands. Several human burials may have been distrubed. What is MMAG doing about this type of activity? Can we document these occurences elsewhere? Popothunters have access to a tool that archeologists don't have: ORGAMIZATIOM? Are there currently archeologists that can do anything effective to protect and encourage conservation of archeological resources on private lands in such cases? Or do we have to stand and watch?
